Develop a new appreciation for these simple, wriggly invertebrates, while learning about decomposing and soil recycling.

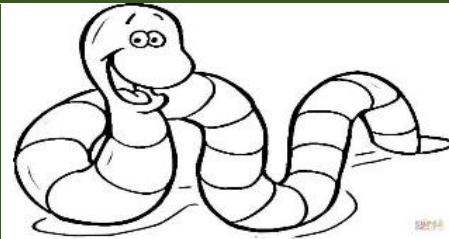
